FIRST-EVER KERRIE OROZCO MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED



This time of year, remembering Kerrie Orozco is done in many ways. This year the first-ever Kerrie Orozco Memorial Scholarship through the Pottawattamie County Community Foundation has been awarded. Similar to the community's recent outpouring towards Mark Burbridge, following Kerrie's tragedy on May 20, 2015 contributions recognizing her took different forms. For example, her friends, family, and the community of Walnut, where Kerrie graduated from high school in May of 2004, held a walk-run event with proceeds going to start a memorial scholarship at the Pottawattamie County Community Foundation (PCCF).
